## In **Maths** we are learning to:

Number: Fractions

Recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/2, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity.

Write simple fractions for example, 1/2 of 6 = 3

Recognize the equivalence of 2/4 and 1/2

Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.

Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0 and in tens from any number, forward and backward.

This is linked closely to learning the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.



In **English** we are learning:

### Reading:

To read aloud books closely matched to their improving phonic knowledge, sounding out unfamiliar words accurately, automatically and without undue hesitation



### Writing:

To write a non-chronological report about different dinosaurs and other animals, thinking about where they live/lived and what they ate/eat. This is linked to our half term to our Science area of study.

## Spelling:

To learn to spell common exception words, learning to spell more words with contracted forms.

#### Grammar:

To write sentences in different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command. To write expanded noun phrases to describe and use subordination (using when, if, that, or because) and co-ordination (using or, and, or but)

To recognize nouns, pronouns, verbs and adverbs within text.

# In **Science** we are learning:

Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive

Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including micro-habitats

Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.

In **Geography** we are learning:

About fieldwork and map skills.

use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries. Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map.

Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.

# In **DT** we are learning:
