If you have a smart phone we would love you to do two things to help improve communication with the school! The first thing would be to download the eschools app (check you have the one with the owl symbol) and enter our school details and your own details.

If you cannot find the details we sent you we have copies of all the information you need in the office so please call. This means that you receive instant messaging from the school and can access more information about your child by logging in to the website.

Secondly, could you add our website to your Home Screen? The website has been designed to be viewed on a phone, tablet or desktop and you should be able to find all the information you need in the different sections. This should help reduce the number of calls into the office about information that is readily available online.

The eSchools app will also help keep the school costs down as messaging is free whereas texts are not. If you have the app you will get an alert every time we send a letter, email or message home so you should never miss out on key information. There are many parents who have downloaded the app but our system is showing that there are still many yet to do so. We are very happy to help you set it up, so please do come in to school and ask.

#### Collection at the End of the Day.

Can we please remind you that we are not able to release children to adults other than those you have notified us of. At the end of the school day, if someone different arrives to collect your child we will not release them without checking with you. If you cannot be contacted we will still not release the child to the person who has come to collect. This can make for awkward situations but it is a safeguarding procedure. If you know someone else is collecting your child the easiest way to inform us is to speak to the class teacher in the morning. If this is not possible please call the office in good time and give the details of the person collecting on your behalf. Please do not leave this until 3pm to tell us as the end of the day is very busy for the office staff too.
