

In Maths we are learning:

Statistics:

Interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables.

Solve one-step and two-step questions using information presented in scaled bar charts and pictograms and tables.

Measurement - length and perimeter

Measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm); mass (kg/g); volume/capacity (l/ml).

Measure the perimeter of simple 2D shapes.

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.

Write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables they know, including for two-digit numbers times one-digit numbers, using mental and progressing to formal written methods.

In Science we are learning about 'Simple Forces including Magnetism'.



- compare how things move on different surfaces
- Observe and predict how magnets attract and repel
- Compare and group materials according to magnetism
- Describe magnets as having two poles



For the second half term the Year 3 topic,

'Off With Your Head!'

will combine Literacy and History.

In History we are learning:



- study the Tudor Era.
- look at changes in social history particularly in relation to crime and punishment.
- compare Tudor punishment with modern day practices.

Writing

In English we are writing to inform. We will be learning about the different skills needed for:

- Writing an biography (Henry VIII)
- Explanation text about Tudor crime and punishment



Reading:

We will be focusing on working primarily with nonfiction texts in the form of autobiographies, biographies, diaries and information text. The teaching emphasis will be on researching, retrieving, explaining and summarising information from these texts.

We will be continuing to develop our reading skills using ERIC, continuing to focus on the novel
