Read, write, order and compare numbers to 10,000,000 and determine the value of each digit.

Round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy.

Use negative numbers in context, and calculate intervals across zero.

Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division

Solve addition and subtraction multi step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why.

Multiply multi-digit number up to 4 digits by a 2 digit number using the formal written method of long multiplication.
