Year 3 Maths:

Multiplication and division

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.

Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (x), division (\div) and equals (=) signs.

Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in context.

Show that multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division of one number by another cannot.

Measurement

Measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm).

Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction.

Measure the perimeter of simple 2D shapes.

Science - Electricity

- Identify common appliances that run on electricity.
- Construct a simple series circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts.
- Identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit.
- Recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit.
- Recognise some common conductors and insulators.

We are learning to master techniques and skills in designing, making and evaluating using our technological knowledge by understanding and using electrical systems in products.


English

Reading:



Primarily in year 3/4 we wish to foster a culture of reading for pleasure as well as developing reading skills. We will be reading a range of fiction, non fiction and poetry texts, identifying their main features, including the use of language and their themes and conventions. We will use prediction, questioning and clarifying skills to discuss the key points and demonstrate our understanding.

Writing:





- Fiction; stories set imagined worlds.
- Non fiction; instructions

We will use models to support planning; orally rehearse and redraft and evaluate and make improvements to our writing.

Spelling:

We will be learning to spell common words correctly, including exception words and unknown words using our knowledge of phonics, prefixes, suffixes etc,

Grammar:

- Use Standard English including a variety of verb forms
- Punctuate sentences consistently.
- Use a wider range of complex conjunctions.
- Use prepositions and fronted adverbials punctuated by a comma.
- Select pronouns and nouns for clarity
- Use and punctuate direct speech.
