Year 3 Maths:

Multiplication and division

- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.
- Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (x), division (÷) and equals (=) signs.
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in context.
- Show that multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division of one number by another cannot.

Fractions

- Recognise and use fractions as numbers: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators.
- Recognise, find and write fractions of a discrete set of objects: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators.
- Count up and down in tenths.
- Recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts and in dividing onedigit numbers or quantities by 10


Writing
