Another recipe to try!

On Tuesday next week the school lunch meat option is Southern Baked Chicken Fingers. These are 100% chicken and absolutely delicious so we thought we would share the recipe with you—if you try them out at home we'd love you to send us some photos to our Twitter account.

Ingredients

- 4 Chicken Breasts (cut in half length ways)
- A tub of natural yogurt
- Mexican spices
- Polenta

The next day: Mix some Mexican spices into some polenta Roll the chicken breast in the spiced polenta mix to coat each piece Bake in the oven for 20 minutes at 180 degrees/ Gas mark 4 or 5

Marinade the chicken breasts in the yogurt overnight.
