The whole school achieved 96.3% attendance.

Attendance

Our recent Ofsted inspection set the school a target to ensure that:

"the attendance of groups of pupils is checked regularly and swift action is taken to ensure that all pupils receive their full entitlement to school"

We employ an Attendance Officer who monitors children's attendance and works with families to support them in making sure their child attends school regularly. The expectation is that children will be in school 100% of the time. However, we know there may be unplanned absences when your child is ill and there may be planned absences which can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. The Government sets thresholds: 90% attendance is classed as **Persistent Absence**. This level of absence means your child has missed 4 weeks of their education in that year. Children find it really difficult to catch up and can easily fall behind their peers.

You are able to see your child's attendance on the eSchools app so you can monitor this yourself. We will send letters out warning you that your child's attendance is dropping and letters to invite you in to meet our Attendance Officer if their attendance continues to drop. We aim to support you in getting your child to school but ultimately it is a parent's responsibility to ensure their child attends school. Failure to do so can result in parenting contracts and fines—we would really like to ensure this does not happen to any of our families. If you are struggling with your child's attendance please come in and talk to us.

Unauthorised Absences are monitored by the Local Authority and they consider each case independently and decide if a fine (a penalty notice) should be issued. Recent changes in current practice mean that only one penalty notice will be issued to a parent of a particular child within a two year period. Any further unauthorised absence recorded within that time will normally mean the parent will be summonsed to appear at a Magistrates Court, which could result in a fine of up to £2,500.

Holidays in term time are not an exceptional circumstance. Please be aware of our term times when booking family holidays. The dates are on our website and on the website/eschools calendar.
