




Congratulations to Apple Class for winning the School Attendance Award with 100% attendance.


The whole school achieved 95.7% attendance overall which is just below our target of 96%

Rotary ShoeBox Appeal

As a school who discuss the UN Rights of the Child with our children we try and think about other children who may not be as fortunate as us in this country. Sianai (Y6) suggested we took part in the Shoebox appeal so that children receive a gift at Christmas. This might be the only gift a child receives in a war-torn country. The idea is that you purchase a shoebox for $\pounds 2$ (this covers the manufacturing costs and transportation costs) and decide the age and gender of the child you would like to surprise and then you fill the box with goodies! The Rotary Club collect the filled boxes from us and send them off a round the world. The boxes will be arriving in school next week and we will begin selling them towards the end of the week and through the following week. Please watch this space for where and when the boxes will be available to buy. There will be an assembly on Monday 17th to explain all of this to the children.
