Winter Infections Circulation- *please read*

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) – South West has written to school this week to warn of an increase in illnesses that are circulating and anticipated to worsen over the coming weeks, likely up to and including the Easter break: respiratory infections (colds, covid, flu) and whooping cough, scarlet fever and chickenpox.

Increasing levels of measles are also being predicted. The UKHSA is advising to make sure you get your child vaccinated with the MMR if you haven't yet done so. It's never too late they say. If you think your child has measles, please contact your GP asap and inform school asap. If they are diagnosed, they must stay off school for a minimum of 4 days from the onset of the rash until they are well enough to return.

While we have not currently had any cases of measles, we have seen quite a big increase in other infections amongst staff and children. The [e-bug website](#) provides useful resources and ideas for how to help keep your child well.

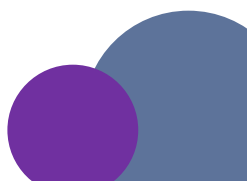
