

Live Music Now Tour with Ensemble Hesperi, In partnership with Torbay Music Hub

This is a unique opportunity for pupils to experience a high quality professional concert or music workshop. The concert is performed by Mary-Jannet Leith (recorders) and Thomas Allery (harpsichord) from Ensemble Hesperi - www.ensemblehesperi.com.

Their programme will be focused on Scottish Baroque music -



Scottish rhythms, dominate melody lines, and airs, jigs and hornpipes often take the place of traditional sonata movements. There will be lots of opportunities for musical learning and participatory activities – some singing, learning new rhythms and students can learn about the instruments and try the harpsichord briefly.

The music of eighteenth century Scotland is loved by performers and audiences alike: its timeless appeal stems from its simple soaring melodies, and the characteristic fusion of traditional 'Baroque' music, rhythms and styles inspired by Scottish dance.
