We have had another busy week full of exciting learning and curriculum enrichment. Year 6 enjoyed working with Chef Mr Bradley in Design Technology. The pupils made a two course Greek meal, which tasted and smelt delicious. The pupils learnt about food hygiene, health and safety as well as learning about traditional Greek seasonality.





In addition, Year Six took part in an exciting STEM and Entrepreneurship Workshop, where innovation met imagination! Working in teams, pupils designed and built Lego cranes to a set specification. Each pupil had a specific role to play in the business project and needed to work together, communicate clearly and listen well to all, so that no errors occurred that would impact on their eventual profits.

The workshop also introduced pupils to a range of STEM careers, helping them connect classroom learning to real-world opportunities. It was inspiring to see our young learners exploring what it means to be an entrepreneur and imagining the possibilities for their futures. Some of their performances were so good they were recognised as showing very good sporting values.
