Homework:

Weekly homework consists of reading; learning, practising and recalling mental maths facts; and a spelling task.

Homework will be given out on Fridays. This should be returned to school on Thursday morning.

Spellings will be stuck into homework books and children will be tested once a fortnight on a Thursday. They will need to practise spellings at home as well as in school.

The expectation is to listen to and discuss your child reading four times a week and record this in their Reading Diary. These will be collected by the class teacher every Monday. If you have written a message for the teacher in the Reading Diary on any other day of the week, please ensure your child shows their teacher that morning.
