We will be continuing to improve our times tables speed and accuracy and knowledge of related division facts throughout the half term.

#### <u>Decimals</u>

- Recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths.
- Recognise and write decimal equivalents to find the effect of dividing a one or two digit number by 10 or 100, identifying the value of the digits in the answer as ones, tenths and hundredths.
- Round decimals with one decimal place to the nearest whole number.
- Compare numbers with the same number of decimal places up to two decimal places.

#### <u>Measurement: Money</u>

- Solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places.
- Estimate, compare and calculate different measures, including money in pounds and pence.

#### <u>Reading</u>



Primarily in year 3/4 we wish to foster a culture of reading for pleasure as well as developing reading skills. We will be reading a range of fiction, non fiction and poetry texts, identifying their main features, including the use of language and their themes and conventions. We will use prediction, questioning and clarifying skills to discuss the key points and demonstrate our understanding.

#### <u>Writing</u>

We will be studying the following text types:

• Narrative writing with a focus on character descriptions

• Poetry

We will use models to support planning; orally rehearse and re-draft and evaluate and make improvements to our writing.

We will be learning to spell common words correctly, including exception words and unknown words using our knowledge of phonics, prefixes, suffixes etc,
