#### In Maths we are learning to: Number – Addition and Subtraction

- Show that the addition of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and subtraction of one number from another cannot.
- \* Solve problems with addition and subtraction: using concrete objects and pictorial representations, including those involving numbers, quantities and measures; applying their increasing knowledge of mental and written methods.
- \* Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems.

#### Measurement: Money

- \* Recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p);
- \* combine amounts to make a particular value.
- \* Find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money.
- \* Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.

#### Multiplication and Division

- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, including recognising odd and even numbers.
- \* Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (x), division (÷) and equals (=) sign.
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts.
- \* Show that the multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division of one number by another cannot.

#### Grammar:

To use both familiar and new punctuation correctly, including full stops and exclamation marks. To use capital letters, and a range of sentences as well as use the present and past tenses correctly and consistently.
