About this topic

Evacuation - the action of evacuating a person or place

Hurricane - a storm with a violent wind

Latitude - the angular distance of a place north or south of the Earth's equator

Maya civilisation - One of the most dominant indigenous societies of Mesoamerica (a term used to describe Mexico and Central America before the 16th century Spanish conquest).

Peninsula- A portion of land nearly surrounded by water and connected with a larger body

Orbit -the curved path of a spacecraft around a star, planet or moon

Region - an area, especially part of a country or the world, having definable characteristics.
