Dear Parents,



This week, we have started welcoming back children who haven't been in school since March. It's been lovely to see these familiar faces back with their friends; some whom already look like they've been in a grow bag for the past 14 weeks.

We started with the return of Year 6 as they gathered for their leavers' barbeques on Monday and Tuesday. Sadly they weren't altogether as a group of 60. Instead they joined a group of 15 for a half day of games, music and catching-up on the field. Many of them wore their take-away St Margaret's hoodies and all left us with a special Leavers' Book full of photos and special memories. They also contributed to a moving leavers' film with individual recordings combined with photos and memories put to music. So although there has been no end-of-year performance, they have still had a special send-off. We wish them all the best for their next adventure at secondary school. They certainly had a unique final year and will go down in the history books as the memorable class of 2020.

In the second part of the week, we welcomed back Year 2s in small groups who haven't been in school since March to meet their new Year 3 teachers: Mr Tullier on Wednesday and Thursday, and Miss Pritchard today. Next week we look forward to seeing Miss Pritchard's second group of new Year 3s on Monday. Then on Tuesday and Wednesday, Mrs Kerswell will be in to meet her new Year 5s while Mrs Kennedy and Mrs Bindon will be in on Thursday and Friday to meet their new Year 5s.

If you are not sure about the times and dates for any of the transition taster days, please do contact the office who will be happy to help.

Just a reminder that for those children who are already in school as part of the key worker / vulnerable groups, transition taster days will take place with their new teachers when they are on the school rota to work. So please don't worry if your child hasn't had a specific invite because they are all scheduled to meet their new teacher at some point before the summer. This includes the current Reception and Year 1 children whose new teachers will be joining them for a day before the summer holiday.

This week some teachers started their livestreaming assemblies as another way of keeping in touch. It sounds like the children and staff enjoyed being able to interact with each other again and there are some interesting assemblies planned for next week with some children wearing a special hat for sharing and fun.

One piece of confirmed news is that children who are clinically extremely vulnerable will be able to return in September.



Covid-19 – Stay Alert

The key message is still to **stay alert** which means you must stay at home as much as possible, work from home if you can, limit contact with other people, keep at least 2 metres apart from others if you go out and wash your hands regularly.

The message about symptoms now includes a loss of taste or smell as well as having a new and continuous cough or a high temperature. In this case stay at home for 7 days if you live alone, stay at home for 14 days if you live with others, including all household members. Only use NHS 111 if your symptoms get worse or are no better after isolation.
