# Spring Term Newsletter No.1 (10.1.20)

Welcome back to the start of the new spring term. I hope you all had a lovely Christmas and I wish you all a healthy and happy 2020. Staff started back on Monday feeling refreshed and recharged, with a training day on ipads and robots. I'm sure your children will be telling you about these at some point.

#### The School Curriculum

A big focus for teachers and teaching assistants' professional development currently is our curriculum design and implementation. Prior to Christmas, the Senior Leadership Team put together a <u>Curriculum Statement</u> to help define and drive the work we do. There is a copy on our website for your information so you can see why we're delivering the type of curriculum we do. A huge part of what we do is about the pastoral support we provide and how we get children ready to learn by supporting their emotional and social development. You can find lots of information about this under our 'Well-being in Action' tab . Mrs Essam, our specialist Nurture Teacher would like to share '<u>Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs</u>' which is a useful motivation-al reminder about human needs and the basics we need to have in place for our children to thrive in their lives.

We have also articulated our school vision. I know we feel very proud of the school we work in and I think the following vision captures in words why we're doing what we do at St Margaret's:

We want ourselves and the children in our care to be successful, resilient and inquisitive learners who are happy and well-equipped to participate positively in the community and wider society.

Year 2 teachers are also offering Maths workshops for parents at the end of January so look out for their letter and please sign up as this will be an invaluable opportunity to learn how we teach and how you can help at home.
