Dear Parents,

This week we've had a school focus on learning to learn; trying to understand how we learn best. We started the week with our whole school remote assembly looking at how we get better at learning a new skill such as football, Maths, solving a puzzle and handwriting. Over the week, children in class have been discussing this further with their teachers and in today's assembly we shared some examples of how children have been learning.

In our staff meeting on Tuesday, Mrs Russell (Reception lead and teacher) and Mrs Tandy (Y1 teacher) trained teachers in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 on how they might develop more enquiry-based learning in their classes. They talked about the 3 characteristics of learning (playing & exploring, active learning and thinking critically) that are the foundation for all the teaching that takes place in the early years and how we might be able to use these more with the older children. It was an engaging and interesting meeting which will help improve our curriculum teaching.

Teachers and children have been experimenting with enquiry-based learning this week in class. Check out the <u>Creative Blog</u> to see how Year 3 Birch Class has been finding out about Stonehenge for example. Look in the <u>Computing Blog</u> to see how Year 1 Beech Class children have been making their own laptops! Have a look in our <u>PSHE Blog</u> to find Joshua harvesting some apples.

Teachers have now completed their baseline assessments of your children. We will be using this information to help us plan for their needs in the coming weeks. You will also be given this information at parents evenings starting after half term.

Due to the pandemic, Parents Evening will take place by telephone call or *Google Meet*. Please book the slot at the time you wish to receive your call. You will be allotted a **ten minute** phone call to discuss your child's progress. Please note that the call will come through as a 'withheld' or 'unknown' number. If you do not answer at your given time slot the teacher may not be able to call back and the appointment might have to be rescheduled. Many thanks for your understanding. Bookings will open on Friday 23rd Oct at 4pm and will close on Thursday 5th Nov at 9pm. Please note that the Foundation Stage Parents Evenings will take place in December because they are still completing assessments.

PARKING APPEAL – please continue to park safely and drive carefully at the start and end of the school day. The congestion has improved thank you but there are still some on-going issues with drives being blocked and cars driving fast.

Important Covid-19 Holiday Updates

Important Community Message – Advice Regarding Self-isolation

One of the key ways to help stop the transmission of the virus is to isolate promptly and adhere to the full isolation timescales. There is evidence that not everybody in Torbay is doing this. Please help us all by following the below advice.

You need to take action to isolate if:

- · I or a member of my household has Covid -19 symptoms
- · I or a member of my household is awaiting a test result
- · I or a member of my household has received a positive Covid-19 test result (regardless of if you or the family member have symptoms)

What does self-isolation mean for a household that has a family member with symptoms or a confirmed case?

- · Your whole household needs to isolate and not leave the family home.
- · Nobody outside of the family bubble should enter the home.

You also need to take action to isolate if:

- · If you have been asked by Track and Trace to isolate
- · You have received a letter from your child's school or activity club asking them to self-isolate.

What does self-isolation mean for a household with a family member who has been a close contact?

- The person that has been asked to isolate cannot leave the family home until the return to normal activities date detailed in any correspondence provided.
- Nobody outside of the family bubble should enter the home.
- Other household members do not need to self-isolate unless they are also a close contact.

We are asking you to do this to reduce the further spread of Covid-19, to friends, family and our wider school community.
