

In Maths we are learning:

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- Mental calculation, including recall of multiplication and division facts up to 12x12.
- Fractions—understand that fractions are part
 of a whole and be able to count up and down in
 tenths and hundredths. Recognise equivalent
 fractions using diagrams. Add and subtract
 fractions with the same denominator and solve
 problems involving fractions.
- Decimals—be able to round decimals to the nearest whole number. Be able to compare decimals up to two decimal places and solve problems involving money and measure.



For the second half term the Year 4 topic,

'Off With Your Head!'

will combine Literacy and History.

In Science we are learning about 'Simple Forces including Magnetism'.



- Compare how things move on different surfaces
- Notice that some forces need contact between two objects
- Observe and predict how magnets attract and repel
- Compare and group materials according to magnetism

In History we are learning:



- study the Tudor Era.
- look at changes in social history particularly in relation to crime and punishment.
- compare Tudor punishment with modern day practices.
- Evaluate and debate the effectiveness of punishment in relation to the crime committed

Writing

In English we are writing to inform. We will be learning about the different skills needed for:

- Writing an biography (Henry VIII)
- Explanation text about Tudor crime and punishment.

Reading:

We will be focusing on working primarily with non-fiction texts in the form of autobiographies, biographies, diaries and information text.

The teaching emphasis will be on researching, retrieving, explaining and summarising information from these texts.

We will be continuing to develop our reading skills using ERIC, continuing to focus on the novel The Demon Dentist by David Walliams.

World Book Day is 1st March and we will be focusing on reading for pleasure with variactivities taking place throughout the day. More information to follow soon. The theme is bedtime stories and the children are welcome to come in in their pyjamas on this day. A reminder that the book fayre will also be in school around this time also. The Scholastic Book Fair will be back in school for a week this half term.



In RE we are learning:

- To explore the meaning behind Easter for Christians
- To explore examples of symbolic language and to deepen understanding of some common

In French we are learning:

 Listen and engage, ask and answer questions- entering simple conversation about asking for items at our French café (linked to DT—prepare and cook some French savoury dishes).
