
Parent Feedback and Parents Evenings

Each school holiday, the charity 'Feed a Child Torbay' provides food for children when they lack free school meals and might otherwise be hungry. Non-perishable meal kits are provided for the families. These are designed to feed a family of four and can be prepared on the hob or in a microwave following the simple instruction sheet provided. Meal kits typically have meat, some vegetables, a starch (potatoes, pasta or rice) and a pudding, often tinned fruit.
