#### Maths News

On Tuesday after school, teaching staff had a maths training session led by our joint Maths leads, Mrs Rice and Miss Lynds. It was really good to get stuck into our core job without any covid distraction. We've been exploring how to best ensure your children are fluent in Maths which is all about the essential skills such as times tables, place value and number bonds.

Mrs Rice and Miss Lynds have updated our policies for Maths calculations so they align with teaching in school and follow the White Rose scheme. You will find the policy for Addition & Subtraction and the policy for Multiplication and Division with lots of examples to help you at home. They are really useful and I recommend them highly.

#### **Covid Update**

We have seen a further increase in cases this week in both staff and children although the rate has slowed compared to the rapid rise last week. There are now cases across the school in every class except Y2 Apple and Y4 Cherry: 57 people in total are currently isolating. All of the classes, except Y5 Willow has had an outbreak (10%+ cases) since January. All classes that have had an outbreak have seen their numbers peak and then decline so far e.g. Y3 Rowan rose to 11 cases and is now down to 2.

Sadly, and as a very last measure, and most reluctantly, we had to close both Reception classes yesterday and today for face to face learning. I am really sorry for any inconvenience this may have caused parents.

Thankfully we haven't heard of anybody being seriously ill. It does appear to be affecting children and staff mildly at the moment. This has meant staff have been mostly been able to keep working from home to support colleagues in school with planning and organising home learning.

Please be reassured that we are doing as much as possible to keep everybody safe as described in previous newsletters. In addition, all classes with an outbreak are having further enhanced cleaning.

We have seen lots of children return to school, and next week expect to see more staff return too.

Once again, I would like to thank our amazing staff for stepping up and supporting colleagues to help cover absence. This is an especial big thank you to our teaching assistants who have been absolutely brilliant!
