
#### **Curriculum** in action

## **Parent Voice- Behavior**



On Wednesday evening, we had the first meeting of our new *Parent Voice* group. We have set this up to make help make sure we are communicating as best as possible with you. It will help ensure we hear your views and gives us a chance to explain in more detail the bigger projects we work on.

This week we looked at our updated Behaviour Policy. Our specialist nurture lead teacher, Mrs Essam spoke about our approach to nurture and attachment. I shared our approach to behaviour management and we had an excellent discussion around this. As a result, we made an addition to the full policy which is to make sure that the school informs parents of children who have witnessed a distressing incident so that they can supported at home. We now have a full policy and a single page one. The latter is a purposefully a one page document that staff can keep at hand to make sure we use a consistent approach across the school. Our next meeting will be on our curriculum work which we are very proud of. Although the pandemic has got in the way somewhat, this year we have moved to a more enquiry style of teaching and learning, specifically to help engage and inspire children.
