

In Maths we are learning to: Number - Place Value

- * Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words.
- * Recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number (tens, ones).
- * Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line.
- * Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = sians.
- * Use place value and number facts to solve problems.
- * Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number. forward and backward.

Number - Addition and Subtraction

- * Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- * Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a two-digit number and ones; a two-digit number and tens; two two-digit numbers; adding three one-digit numbers.
- * Show that the addition of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and subtraction of one number from another cannot.
- * Solve problems with addition and subtraction: using concrete objects and pictorial representations, including those involving numbers, quantities and measures; applying their increasing knowledge of mental and written methods.
- * Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems.

In Literacy we are learning to:

Reading:

- * Read accurately by blending the sounds in words that contain the graphemes taught so far, especially recognising alternative sounds for graphemes.
- * Understand both the books that they can already read accurately and fluently and those that they listen to by answering and asking questions.
- * To recognise and use when reading aloud with expression the use of commas.
- * Explore and play with rhyming patterns.

Writing:

- * To create captions to describe features around school.
- * To write postcards and letters from Penguin Small.

Spelling:

* To become familiar with the use of high frequency words when reading and writing.

Grammar:

To use both familiar and new punctuation correctly, including full stops, capital letters, exclamation marks and question marks the present and past tenses correctly and consistently

In Geography we are learning:

Locational knowledge

Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.

Human and physical geography

Identify daily and seasonal weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the north and south poles.

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical and human features.

Geographical skills and fieldwork

Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage.

Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

Use simple observational skills to study key human and physical features of environments.

The expectation is to listen to your child read four times a week and record this in their Reading Record.
