Welcome back to a blustery wet second half of the autumn term. Staff and children look like we've all had a good break and recharged for the 8 week run to Christmas. Our PSHE theme for this half term is 'Celebrating Difference' so we started this week with an assembly on *tolerance* which is one of our British values. We looked at how over the course of history, our ancestors all emigrated to this great country, whether it was as Celts, Romans, Angles, Saxons, Vikings or with the Norman invaders. Or whether it was closer relatives from more recent times, we all make up a rich tapestry in the UK. We saw also how our surnames often tell a story of our past. Back in class, children have been asking questions to be inquisitive to find out more about their peers. As educators we feel a big responsibility in this complex world to help prepare children to be tolerant of others to help them take their place in a fully functioning and harmonious society.


