Looking for Uniform? - Correction

Caritas is a charity shop in **Chelston** (not St Marychurch) which has free items of uniform.

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- E-scooters can only be used on public roads if rented as part of a government-backed trial.
- Private owners of e-scooters can only use them on private land and not on public roads, cycle lanes or pavements.
- To use an e-scooter from an official trial, you need to have category Q entitlement on your driving licence.

 Cycle helmets are recommended for e-scooter riders, but not legally required. Inappropriate use of e-scooters could lead to riders having it seized, having their accounts to hire one suspended, being prosecuted or fined.
