
Dear Parents,

We started this week with our assembly linked to the theme of *changing me*, looking at how we can change and learn from our mistakes. LFD, PCR and Isolation Clarification – Public Health Update

LFD tests should **not** be used by anyone who is symptomatic. If you have any symptoms of Corona Virus you should book a PCR test at a test site.

LFDs detect the virus in people **without** symptoms so each positive case we find is one that would have gone otherwise undetected. They identify asymptomatic people with a high viral load who are the most likely to spread the virus further.

Anyone who tests positive using an LFD test will be asked to take a confirmatory follow-up PCR test. It remains essential that anyone who gets a positive LFD result self-isolates immediately for 10 days, as well as the other members of their household. You must only leave home for your follow-up test. You should arrange your confirmatory PCR immediately. For the fastest result, we suggest you <u>book a PCR test at a test site</u>. You can also book a home test <u>online</u> or call 119 to book a test. A PCR test will confirm if you have been affected by coronavirus or not, and reduce unnecessary self-isolation by you and your household. If you then receive a negative result from the PCR, and the PCR test was taken within 2 days of the LFD, then you and your contacts will be informed you can cease self-isolating.
