Dear Parents,

Week 2 of the autumn term has gone well. The sun has been shining and there are lots of happy little faces in school with the children still clearly enjoying being back with their friends and enjoying the new curriculum. Reception children have enjoyed their part-time start to primary school, settling in particularly well in their newly designed snazzy classrooms. From Monday we will have 60 Reception children in at any one time so look out for a bit more people traffic at drop off and collection.

You should by now have received the start of year information from your class teachers. This is also added to the school website under 'Curriculum Information' along with the Collectables. As mentioned last week, these new Collectables are the outcomes that children will be working towards achieving in that subject or topic. They will be very useful to you so you know what is being taught in school and how you can support at home. We are encouraging the children to think of them as they would a sticker book. The aim is for them to collect them all over the year. Each one is unique and creatively designed to make them interesting and engaging. Teachers and teaching assistants have worked together to create these in a joint project. They have really worked hard to make them special for your children, and to align them with their ideas for inspiring them in the classroom. Please do have a look at them and print them. If you don't have a hard copy, just email the teacher and they'll be happy to send one home. If you have any feedback on them I'd love to hear it.

Our whole school remote assemblies this week have looked at how we understand ourselves; what are we good at, what do we need to improve with and most importantly, how do we get better at something. Staff have been learning how to do the Rubik's cube to help us understand better what it's like to be a learner again and today Mrs Pike showed us her Rubik's skills in assembly. She also shared how she'd learnt to do it in just over 2 minutes! If there are any young challengers out there who want to try to beat Mrs Pike, you're welcome to have a go. I believe we have one child in Year 1 who could give her a run for her money.

Mr Thomas who maintains our orchard in a voluntary capacity would like to say thanks to the PTA for coming up "trumps by recycling a couple of large water butts to help us triple our water conservation."

Thanks to everybody out there for engaging with us on attendance during this time of colds and runny noses. We are managing to maintain over 95% attendance each day which is good news in these uncertain days. Mrs Newman has put together an attendance flow chart to help you with any further tricky decisions. It contains the latest government guidance on what constitutes COVID-19 symptoms which I've also listed below for your information. Attendance heroes this week:

1st Place: Pine and Oak Class with 100%!!!

This means that Pine and Oak have earnt an attendance star. Once classes collect 3 of these, they get a special non-uniform day in school.

Clarification on the main symptoms of COVID-19:

- A high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- A new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you have noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Please continue to bear with us at drop off and collection. The building works outside Year 1 are due to be largely finished by Wednesday next week. After which we will be able to better assess how drop off and collection might work in the longer term as we will have greater access.

At drop off and collection please can parents not enter the classrooms. We are trying to minimise any opportunity for transmission. If you need to chat to the class teacher you can either pass a message via Mrs Pike or I on the gate or email through on the class email. Thank you for your understanding.

Please consider carefully about parking and traffic congestion as it can be very busy at certain times with a lot of children and families crossing the road. Remember to also please be mindful of our neighbours, ensuring they can access their drives and get out to work. Thank you
