School Performance Data


As we draw to the end of another academic year we would like to share some of the school's Y6 data with you as we are proud of how hard the children have worked and how well they have achieved. The children sit a test (SATS) in May for Reading, Maths and Grammar and are assessed by their class teacher for their writing. We have higher percentages of children achieving across all the subjects than the national average, as the table below shows:

Combined Measure

The Government also checks how many of these children achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined. We are delighted that 74% of our children achieved this compared to 61% nationally.

The demands of the new curriculum are incredibly high and the children have risen to the challenge. We are immensely proud of them!



Scaled Scores

Another measure the Government checks is the Scaled Score. 100 is the scores assigned to the 'average' pass mark in the tests. Again, our children's average score is higher than the national scaled score.

Children working at a Higher Standard

We don't have any national comparison data for this as it is not available until late September but, regardless, we are proud of the children as many scored brilliantly on their tests. Last year 5% of children nationally achieved at Greater Depth in Combined Subjects whereas we had 9%. This year we have 16% of children which is a fantastic result.

Pupil Premium Children

The Government provide schools with additional funding (Pupil Premium) to close the gap between children they identify as disadvantaged and their peers. Again, our Pupil Premium children have achieved fantastic results and in English a higher percentage of Pupil Premium pupils achieved the Expected Standard than Non Pupil Premium pupils.

There will be additional school data released in September which we will report to you.

End of Year School Reports

Your children will be coming home with their end of year report today, and will report on your child achievement if they took the Phonic Screening Check in June and end of Foundation Stage, KS1 and KS2 results.

There are no formal Parents Meetings at the end of the year but if you have any concerns based on the end of year report you are very welcome to book an appointment with your child's class teacher to discuss these.
