### The PTA and Our School.

We are very lucky to have an active PTA and, as a school, we really appreciate the time and effort the members put into organising events and raising money for the school. The PTA fund things for the children that we might otherwise not be able to afford, especially in times of tightened school budgets. The money they raise from their Film nights or cake sales all goes back to the children! Their recent cake sale raised £151.40 which is fantastic, so thank you for your support.

Did you know, the PTA is formed mainly of about 12 parents? They meet, they plan, they organise and run the events. All of this is done voluntarily. They would love more parents to join them so please do watch out for events and meeting dates in the future.

When the school and the PTA hold events we have to set deadlines. The deadlines allow the school and the PTA members time to communicate so that risk assessments can be carried out, fire registers organised, food bought according to numbers attending etc. Whilst we would never wish to disappoint a child we cannot continuously extend the deadlines as this involves a huge amount of work for our admin team, who are already incredibly busy. We send out letters, we put reminders on the weekly newsletter, and we add events to our calendar which appear on the school website and the eschools app; this is how we communicate with the families of the 418 children currently attending the school.

Parents who have missed the deadline often tell us they didn't know about the event as they don't have time to read their emails, the newsletters or haven't downloaded the app. We understand how busy life is these days but we would encourage you all to check the school website, download the app and read the newsletters we send you or your child will continue to miss out.
